Tonight in "A Wonderful World...Know More About It", the question is, "Which African nation has come closest to winning the FIFA World Cup?"

In 1990, led by 38-year-old Roger Milla, Cameroon defeated the world champions Argentina, on the way to the round of eight.

Their hotly contested quarter-final match against England was decided in extra-time, by a penalty kick in the 105th minute.

In 2002, Senegal matched Cameroon's achievement, defeating the world champions France, before losing to Turkey 1-0 in extra-time of their quarter-final.

Senegal's El-Hadji Diouf was named one of that tournament's top ten players.

With a little luck and a lot of hard work, Africa's best showing yet will come next year at the 2010 World Cup.
