In this inaugural year, 16 will compete. universities There are five universities each from Tanzania and Uganda. As host country, Kenya has competing. six universities The selection of universities was made by the programme producer, Richard Reid TV, Celtel, the Permanent Secretaries of Education in Kenva, Tanzania and Uganda and the Inter-University Council of East Africa.

Student teams will attend a championship festival February 11-16, 2007, at the Safari Park Hotel in Nairobi during which they will compete for the Celtel East Africa Championship.

After preliminary competition to seed the teams, the 16 universities will compete in a knockout series of 15 games which will be recorded for later broadcast throughout Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda.

Each Celtel Africa Challenge team is composed of three players plus an alternate. A Celtel Africa Challenge Coach and Liaison has been named at each university to prepare the students for the competition.

Teams will be competing for institutional grants for their universities and money for themselves. The farther the team progresses in the tournament, the bigger the grants they will
